Family circumstances

Keston grew up in the northern region of Malawi in Karonga district. He was brought up in a polygamous family and has 11 siblings. His mother is his father's second wife. His parents attended primary school – he is the first in his family to continue with school. The household income relies on small scale farming to earn a modest income.

Education

Keston received a scholarship to attend a private secondary school which was granted based on academic performance. He achieved **10 points** in his Malawi School Certificate of Education (MSCE). Student points are calculated by adding the 6 highest subject points together. The better you do, the lower the score; 1-2 points = distinction; 3-4 points = credit; 5-6 points = pass. Keston did extremely well to achieve **10 points**!

There are just 49 registered dentists in Malawi. In the UK there are a total of 46,000.
